Safety in the home – article from local resident

I would like to take this opportunity to share with you a recent experience that I hope will encourage everyone to consider taking preventative fire safety measures in their homes. When I moved to my house in Brocton just over 3 years ago, I discovered that the gas fire in my lounge did not work. I was reluctant to use it due to the fact that when I had a survey carried out on the property, I was informed by my chartered surveyor that the previous owners 'had a natural distrust of service engineers'. Neither the gas boiler nor the gas fire had ever been serviced.

In early February 2017, I asked my gas safe registered engineer to service my gas fire in the hope that he would be able to get it working again. When he removed the fire from the chimney he discovered a large pile of nesting material, soot and mortar. He carried out two smoke tests and it became immediately clear that my chimney was completely blocked as all of the smoke came back into the room - not a single bit of smoke was drawn up and out of the chimney. Having found a local chimney sweep who came out the following day, it took over 2 hours to unblock my chimney. Plus an additional 2 sacks' worth of nesting material, soot and mortar were removed. The sweep made the comment that this was one of the worst chimneys that he had come across for quite some time and that it appeared unlikely that the chimney had ever been cleaned.

I found it extremely shocking to be told that had my gas fire been in working order, it was almost certain that I could have died of carbon monoxide poisoning as no air was being drawn up the chimney.

I am writing this article to urge everyone to take some simple, but potentially lifesaving measures, to improve the safety of their homes. I would urge you all to:-

- 1. Get your boiler serviced on an annual basis by a qualified engineer.
- 2. Get all fires gas, coal, and wood burners etc, serviced on an annual basis by a qualified engineer.
- 3. Get all working chimneys swept on a regular basis the frequency will depend upon the type of fuel you burn and how frequently you use your fire.
- 4. Fit caps to any disused chimneys and fit bird guards to all working chimneys.
- Install carbon monoxide alarms in all rooms were you have a boiler or gas/coal/wood burning fire.

The above experience gave me a real fright and it was quite sobering to think that I may have died from carbon monoxide poisoning. The previous owners' 'natural distrust of service engineers' could have cost me my life; thankfully my trust of service engineers saved my life!

Finally, I would like to mention the fantastic service offered by Staffordshire Fire & Rescue Service. They offer a free home fire risk check, which is intended to provide basic fire awareness for home owners/occupiers based on a visual assessment of their properties. They will fit smoke alarms free of charge as well as discussing preventative measure that can be taken to reduce the risk of fires. They can be contacted on Tel: 0800 0241 999.

The above article is indeed a sobering one and highlights the real importance of safety in the home. Staffordshire Fire and Rescue Service offer advice and free home fire risk checks. Please visit their website for more information -

Brocton Football Club



A late revival has given Brocton's 1st team an outside chance of avoiding relegation to the first division of the Midland Football League. During February Brocton eased away from bottom place in the league, and victories away at Loughborough, and title-chasers Westfields have seen them narrow the gap between them, and AFC Wulfrunians, to just three points. At the time of writing they are still six points from safety, and with only six games to play, a return to division one still looks very much on the cards.

The reserve team are firmly rooted at the foot of the reserve division. However they have played fewer than any other team in the league, and still with eight games remaining, they would hope to pick up a few points to lift them off bottom spot. They have reached the semi-final of the bowl completion, so despite a poor league placing there could still be some silverware at end of the season.

The youth section of the club, shows a far more encouraging picture. The Under 21's are guaranteed runners-up in the North Division of the Under 21 section of the Midland League. The U-18 team is currently in 4th place in the Bilston Partnership (u-19 section), and the U-16's and U-15's are 3rd and 2nd respectively in their relevant sections of the 1st Division of the Lichfield league. Additionally the Under 16 team reached the League cup final, unfortunately going down 4-3 in that game, and are through to the final 96 teams of the FA People's Cup – a national competition, the finals of which will be held in Birmingham on 1st May. The Under 15's have also progressed to their League Cup final at St George's Park in Burton.

Construction work is now complete on the new hospitality/kitchen unit at Silkmore Lane, and an official opening is anticipated in the coming weeks. It should be fully functional by the start of the 2017/18 season.

The club's annual sporting evening was another success this year. This year's speaker at the White Eagle club was former Arsenal and Leeds goalkeeper John Lukic. The event raised over £3,500 for the club and £1000 for this season's chosen charity the Local Air Ambulance.
